


Bamboo curtains

Hong Kong is one of the last places in the world where bamboo is still widely used for scaffolding in construction. It is flexible, strong and cheaper than steel and aluminium – metal alternatives that are now more commonly used on the mainland and elsewhere in Asia. In Hong Kong, skilled armies of scaffolders can erect enough bamboo to engulf a building in a day using techniques that are thousands of years old, and have been passed down through generations.
